Approach: Station Level: Year 4 and year 8

Questions/instructions:


This activity uses the computer.

Commentary:

A broad range of considerations were referred to by students at both year levels. The largest differences ("easy to defend" and "good for food") probably reflected additional study of traditional Māori practices between year 4 and year 8.
