Commentary:

About 20 percent more year 8 than year 4 students attained the highest level on each of the nine task components examining the quality of persuasive writing. Despite this, about half of the year 8 students could manage no better than 'a little justified' in arguing for their chosen position. There was very little change in performance between 1998 and 2002, at either year level.

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
