## Kiwi

Approach: One to one

Level: Year 4 and year 8

Focus: Searching for information on the internet.

Resources: Laptop computer with simulation of part of the world wide web, question card, recording book

## Questions/instructions

Click the Kiwi button.

Ask the student to fill in the questionnaire, then click *Done*.

You are doing a study about birds called kiwi. You need to find the answers to these questions.

Give student question card.

• You are going to search information from the internet to answer some questions.
 • A small part of the internet has been put on this computer, it will help you to find the information you need.
 • This computer is not connected to the internet, so it doesn't work exactly the same as when you are plugged in.
 • DO type key words to search for information.
 • Do NOT type the names of web sites.
 • Use Seeker to search the web pages.
 • When Finished, Choose Kingston or Kiwi from the Apple menu.

## Commentary

This simulated internet seaching task showed quite high success among the year 8 students, but year 4 students enjoyed much less success. The survey responses show that about 14 percent of year 4 students and 20 percent of year 8 students said that they searched the internet at school more than once a week. At home, these percentages rose to 36 and 52 percent.
