Winston Churchill was born in 1874. As a young man he became a soldier, then a war reporter in the Boer War, and finally a politician. Before World War I he was a minister in the Liberal government, but later he joined the Conservatives.

In the 1930s he warned people bout the dangers of another war

about the dangers of another war. War came, and he was made prime minister in 1940. He inspired the British people to carry on to victory. After the war, he stayed in politics until 1964, the year before he died.



About one third of the year 4 students got 4 or 5 questions right, while 14 percent got none right. Students could ask for help with reading, but limited reading skills make the use of such a reference book very difficult even if someone is available to read selected passages.
